Term Book Report

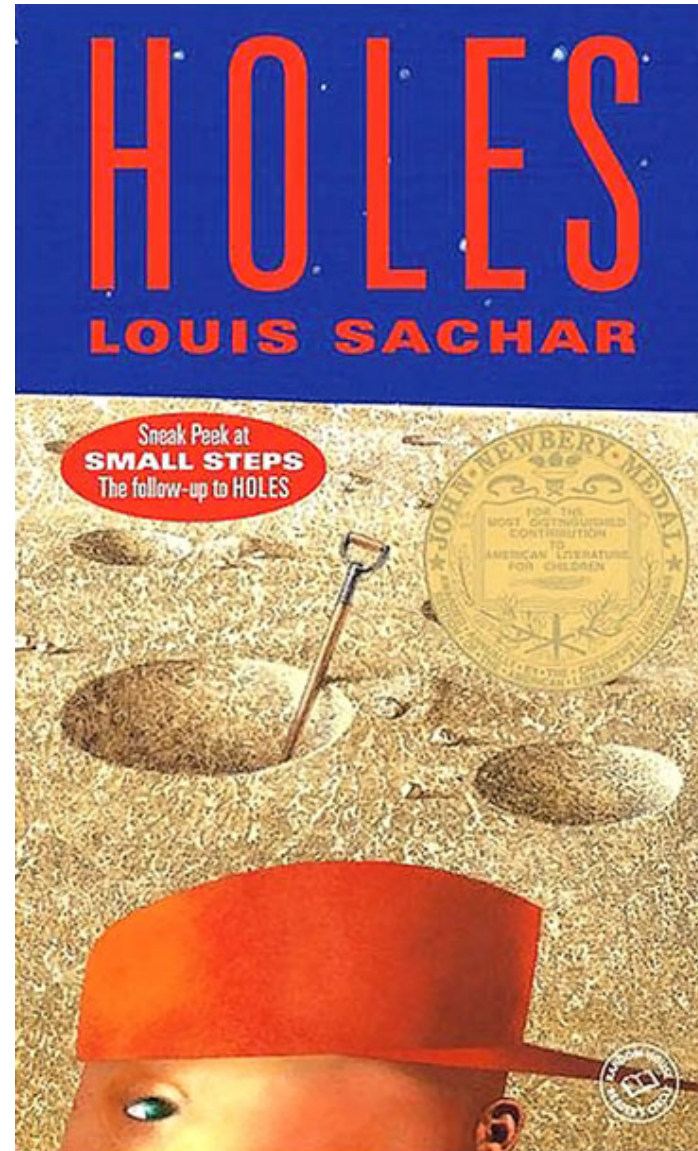
- Every term, you will be required to choose one book to read for a book report.
 - Even if you finish before the term ends, you still must be reading and making progress in another book everyday in class to get your bell ringer points.
- You will be required to answer as many questions as you can to get to **50 points**.
- 1-3 point questions need to be written in at least 1 paragraph to answer the question completely. 4-6 point questions need to be written in at least 2-3 paragraphs to answer the question completely.
 - If you do sloppy or incomplete work, you will not get complete points.
- This is due the week before the end of the term. **DO NOT** put this off until the last minute, or forget to do it. It will be worth **100 points** on your final term grade. If you do not do it, your grade will drop significantly.

How to PICK a good book:

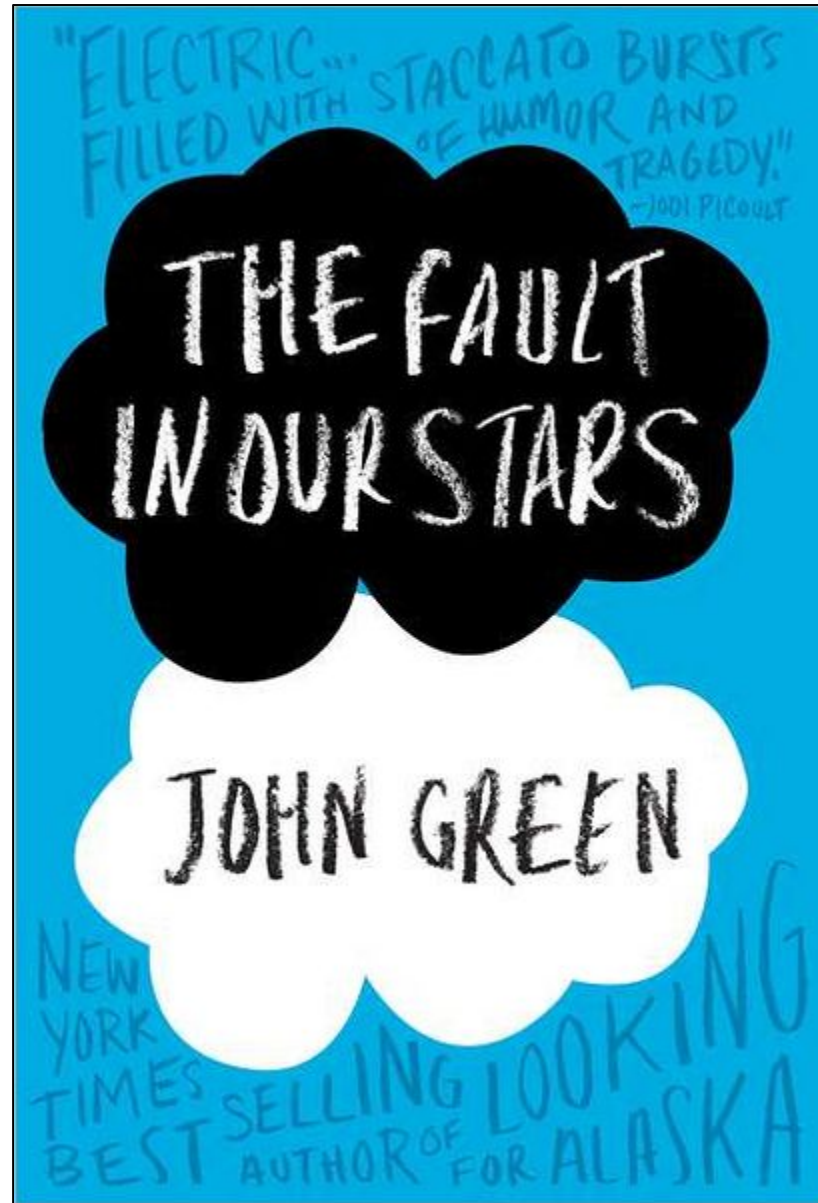
- **P**urpose — Are you reading for fun? Are you reading to learn something?
- **I**nterest — What types of books and genres do you like? Does the book summary interest you?
- **C**omprehend — Is the book within your reading zone? Do you understand what you are reading?
- **K**now the words — How many difficult words are there on the page?
 - 0-1 unknown = too easy
 - 2-3 unknown = just right
 - 4-5 unknown = too difficult

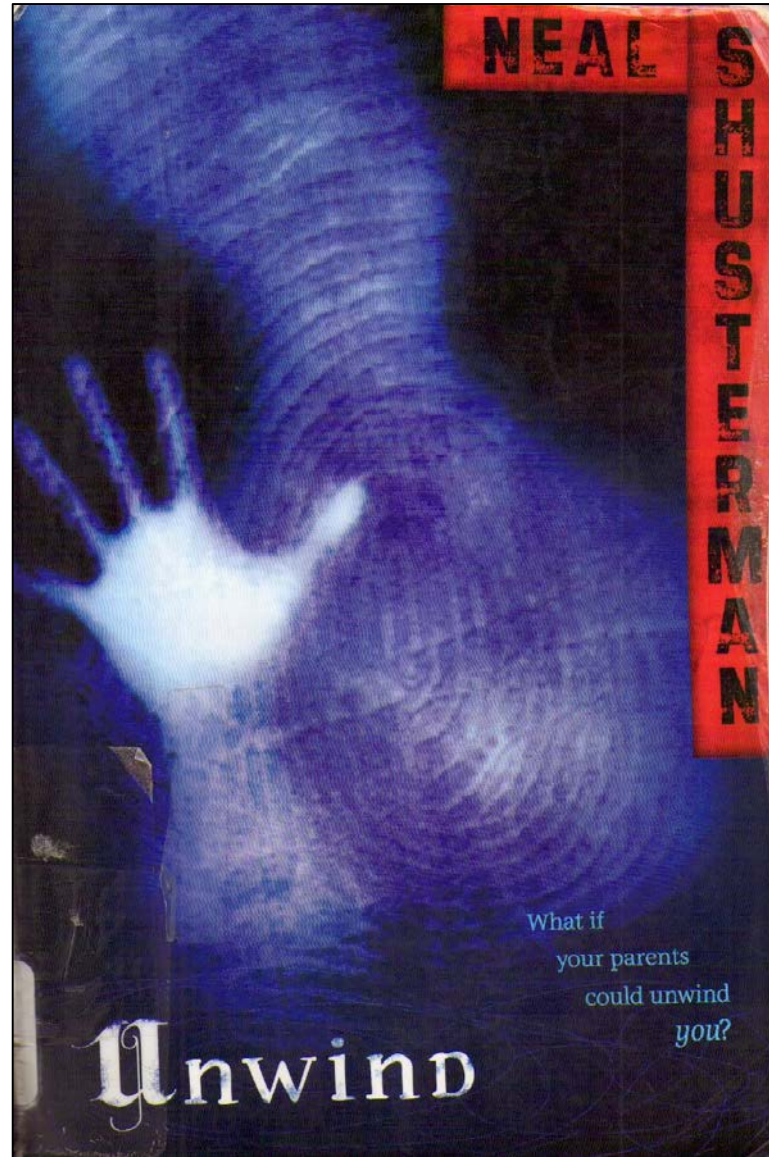

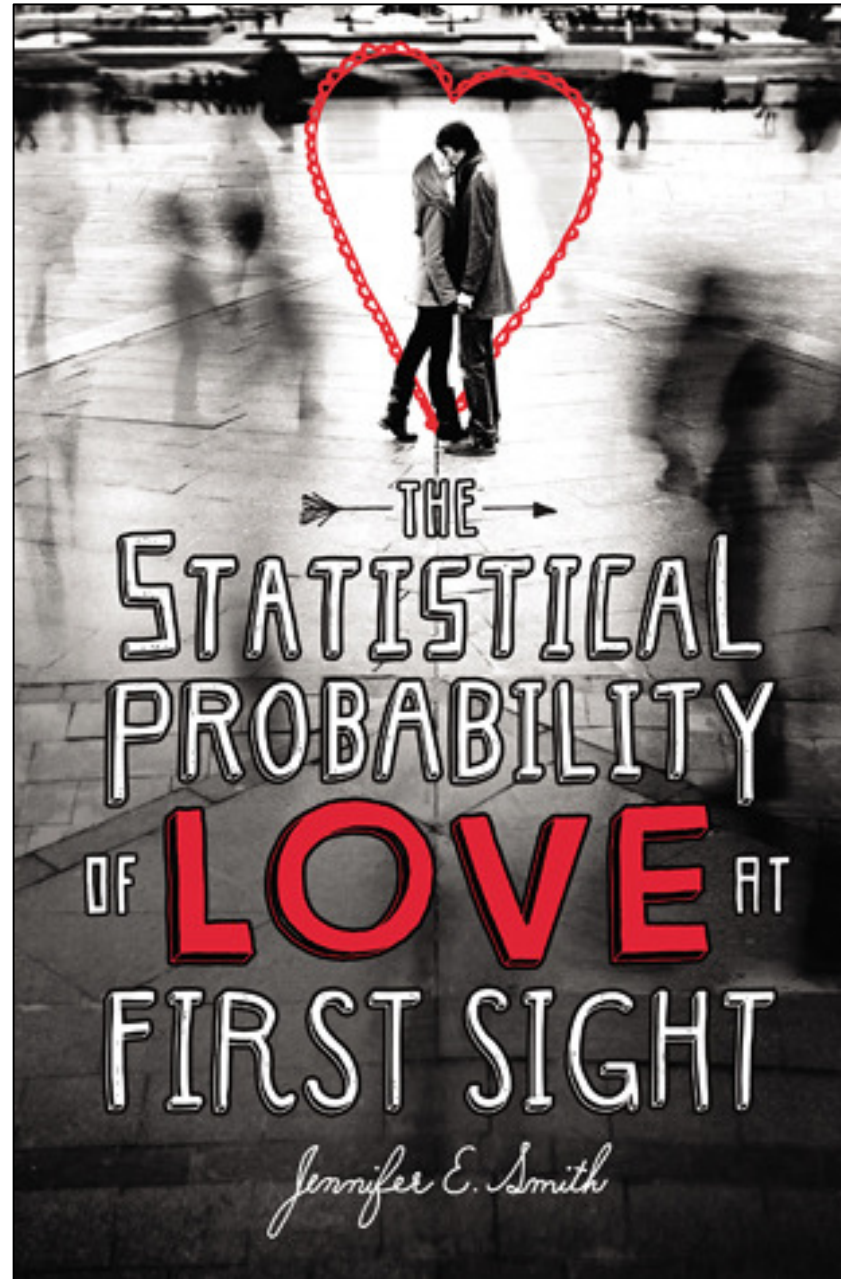
